

Students report on RANAS

A delegation of Italian students conducted a survey involving 254 participants. Among those surveyed, there were 226 boys, making up 89% of the total, and 28 girls, comprising 11% of the respondents.

Cleaning of public space

The vast majority (92.13%) of the students considers that the failure to clean public spaces is a problem that has direct repercussions on environmental sustainability of the local community.

At the same time more than half of them (57,48%) contribute to this failure, while only a bit more than 4 on 10 try to be coherent

Transport

54% of students use public transport more than 5 times a week for mostly economical reasons. This is the main reason for having a relative majority of students (63,78%) indicating the importance of the impact of the use of public transport to local community.



Energy

The vast majority (88.19%) of the students consider that the waste of energy is a problem that has direct repercussions on environmental sustainability of the local community

During the debate, some students raised other points that needed to be addressed:

the excessive use of heating/excessive smoking in youths /the fact that the electric cars reduce pollution in rich countries but devastate the rest of the world in the extraction of metals for batteries/ noise pollution/ food waste and the intensive farming and food alternatives / sea pollution/ clean energy and nuclear energy / the issue of personal hygiene/ packaging in the products/ the need for social and economic sustainability.

Purchase of useless item

A majority of students (67,32%) considers the purchase of useless items as a problem that has direct impact on environmental sustainability, more on a general level than something referable to the local community.
